THE BISHOP OF ROME – ANTICHRIST

"Let no one deceive you by any means; for that Day will not come unless the falling away comes first, and the man of sin is revealed, the son of perdition, who opposes and exalts himself above all that is called God or that is worshiped, so that he sits as God in the temple of God, showing himself that he is God." – 2 Thessalonians 2:3,4

In the "Treatise on the Power and Primacy of the Pope" our Lutheran Confessions, contained in the Book of Concord, clearly indicate that the marks of the Antichrist coincide with the

papacy. That is, the office of the pope of the Roman Catholic Church bears the marks of the Antichrist that Scripture indicates.

This religious deception and teacher of error comes from within the church, not from civil government, as some have erroneously taught.

That man, the Antichrist, opposes the person and work of Christ, setting himself not only in the place of, but above Christ and His teachings. When the Bishop of Rome, the pope, speaks authoritatively from his seat (ex cathedra), his teaching must be accepted as dogma and is binding.

The pretext is that the pope is the vicar of Christ on earth and that he possesses supremely the authority of the church and its ministry of the keys.

But, the doctrine and teaching of the papacy disagrees with the pure and saving Gospel of Jesus.

First, he assumes for himself the right to change the doctrine of Christ and the worship of God and substitutes his own doctrine and worship as divine.

Second, he assumes power to loose and bind sins not only in this life but also in purgatory after this life for those who need to suffer temporal punishments before being admitted to heaven.

Third, the pope cannot be judged by the church and exalts himself above the decisions of councils



and the whole church.

Finally, he is a defender of false doctrine and errors, as can be seen so clearly today, and the pope can inflict great penalties upon any or all who dissent from his authority.

Our Lord warns us to beware of false prophets (Matthew 7:15)

Jesus clearly forbids his apostles and, therefore, his pastors to express lordship over one another. He admonished his disciples to be servants.

He sent his disciples out as equals, without discrimination. He granted

to none a prerogative or lordship over another.

If Peter is the first pope, as Rome asserts, then Paul contradicts this in Galatians 2 when he did not acknowledge Peter as his superior nor source of authority for Christian doctrine.

The authority of the ministry depends upon the Word of God and all ministers are equal in their standing before God and the church.

Our salvation does not depend on submitting to the Bishop of Rome, but depends on our Lord Jesus Christ, who builds his church upon the rock, that is, the confession of St. Peter that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the living God.

Peter was told to "feed my sheep." (John 21).

We can see that the marks of Antichrist are found in the papacy and that the Roman church and its pope continue to teach false doctrines including Mariolatry, purgatory, indulgences, enforced celibacy, denial of justification by grace through faith alone, transubstantiation, and many others.

Christ alone is our rock and our foundation. His church and her pastors stand upon the pure Gospel and Sacraments, which is where Luther stood and where we stand today as confessional Lutherans.



HYMNS THAT SING OF CHRIST: LSB 555 "SALVATION UNTO US HAS COME"

Salvation unto us has come
By God's free grace and favor;
Good works cannot avert our doom,
They help and save us never.
Faith looks to Jesus Christ alone,
Who did for all the world atone;
He is our one Redeemer.

What God did in His Law demand
And none to Him could render
Caused wrath and woe on ev'ry hand
For man, the vile offender.
Our flesh has not those pure desires
The spirit of the Law requires,
And lost is our condition.

It was a false, misleading dream
That God His Law had given
That sinners could themselves redeem
And by their works gain heaven.
The Law is but a mirror bright
To bring the inbred sin to light
That lurks within our nature.

From sin our flesh could not abstain,
Sin held its sway unceasing;
The task was useless and in vain,
Our guilt was e'er increasing.
None can remove sin's poisoned dart
Or purify our guileful heart-So deep is our corruption.

Yet as the Law must be fulfilled
Or we must die despairing,
Christ came and has God's anger stilled,
He has for us the Law obeyed
And thus the Father's vengeance stayed
Which over us impended.

Since Christ has full atonement made
And brought to us salvation,
Each Christian therefore may be glad
And build on this foundation.
Your grace alone, dear Lord, I plead,
Your death is now my life indeed,
For You have paid my ransom.

Let me not doubt, but truly see
Your Word cannot be broken;
Your call rings out, "Come unto Me!"
No falsehood have You spoken.
Baptized into Your precious name,
My faith cannot be put to shame,
And I shall never perish.

The Law reveals the guilt of sin
And makes us conscience-stricken;
But then the gospel enters in
The sinful soul to quicken.
Come to the cross, trust Christ, and live;
The Law no peace can ever give,
No comfort and no blessing.

Faith clings to Jesus' cross alone
And rests in Him unceasing;
And by its fruits true faith is known.
For faith alone can justify;
Works serve our neighbor and supply
The proof that faith is living.

All blessing, honor, thanks, and praise
To Father, Son, and Spirit,
The God who saved us by His grace
All glory to His merit.
O triune God in heav'n above.
You have revealed Your saving love;
Your blessed name we hallow.

This is a great hymn, a bold hymn, with a strong statement of the Reformation's faith. The text was written by Paul Speratus. When he wrote it he was a priest in the Western Church, while imprisoned for espousing Luther's cause and openly and freely preaching Luther's Biblical and evangelical doctrine.

Since this hymn helped spread the Reformation teaching on wings of song, as it were, it was esteemed similar to Luther's hymns and was gladly included in all Lutheran hymnals. As a teaching and confessional hymn, a mark of orthodoxy, pietism sought every excuse to put it aside. The Enlightenment would have nothing to do with it, seeing it as simply a rhymed paraphrase of the doctrine of justification by faith. Others saw it as a venerable relic and were reluctant to include it in a Lutheran Hymnal since the hymnal should not be a shrine for relics, or so 'they' said.

On the other hand, there were those who considered it one of the finest of hymns and one that dare not be cast aside. They made it clear it was the song of a soul, filled with the peace of the gospel over the rediscovered fundamental truths of the Christian faith.

Paul Speratus (1484-1551) was born in Rothlen near Ellwangen in Wurttemburg. After spending quite some time in Parish and at various Italian universities studying the humanities, he became a preacher at Dinkelsbuhl, Bavaria in 1518. He also served as preacher at Wurzburg and Salsburg, but in each place he was forced to leave for openly expressing his evangelical views. He had avidly read some of Luther's early works which would not be tolerated.

Shaking the dust from his feet, so he wrote, he married Anna, thus becoming one of the first priests to openly break the vow of celibacy. He then moved to Vienna where he lived as a private individual and earned his Doctor of Theology degree. He preached a sermon based on Romans 12:1-5 on January 12, 1522, where he defended and praised marriage and courageously and joyfully expounded the doctrine of justification by faith at the very time Luther's books were being burned in Vienna causing the theological faculty of the University of Vienna to brand him as a heretic. Forced to leave Vienna, he spent a brief period in Ofen where the Reformation had taken root. He became, by invitation, a preacher at the cloister church in Iglau, Morovia. King Ludwig imprisoned him in Olmutz in 1523. He was fed only bread and water for twelve weeks and threatened with death by fire. Finally free, he went to Wittenberg and helped Luther prepare the Achtliederbuch and translated Luther's Formula Missae into German. On the recommendation of Luther, he became court preacher for Duke Albrecht at Konigsberg, East Prussia in 1525. In 1530, he assumed the bishop's office in Pomerania. In this poverty stricken area, he served with tireless devotion and energy, steadfast in the evangelical truth until his death.

The tune *Es Ist Das Heil* is the anonymous beautiful tune that appeared with the Speratus text in *Etlich Christlich Lider* in 1524.


Place your CRV plastic and aluminum beverage containers in the bins located in the Parish Hall. Proceeds support the Youth Group.

And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. (Deut 6: 6-7 ESV)

In the beginning of *Luther's Small Catechism* it says that "The head of the family should teach it in a simple way to his household." With this in mind let's look at the children's book, *My First Catechism*.



The notes from the publisher, Concordia Publishing House, suggest that this book is for 6-10 year olds; however, it can probably be started from about age 3-4, certainly age 5.

It is an illustrated version of *Luther's Small Catechism* and answers a child's most repeated question, "Why?" It does this by not only including illustrations that are relevant, but by including a story that explains the "why" as taken from scripture. It does this for both the commandment as well as for the statement "what does this mean?" You can get an example of this by going to the Concordia Publishing House website or Amazon, entering "My First Catechism" in the search box and then clicking on "look inside" under the picture of the book.

There is an activity book that goes along with this book that older children can complete themselves or you as a parent can use it as a guide to ask more questions.

Consider starting this book, My First Catechism, at an early age with your children and as your children grow older continue building on this training with the new edition of Luther's Small Catechism with Explanation.
