OUR ELDER AND HIS DEACONS

The spiritual leader(s) of a Christian congregation is the elder, according to the Bible. Our Lutheran churches, for the most part, typically have one elder who is called a bishop, overseer, or pastor. This elder teaches and preaches the word of God and administers the sacraments of Jesus. He shepherds the souls entrusted to his care. Ephesians 4:11, I Timothy 3:2, 5:17, Titus 1:9, and Hebrews 13:17.

Deacons have a role in the church too, but their role is different from the elder. The

biblical role of deacons is to take care of the physical and logistical needs of the church so the elder can concentrate on his primary calling.

This distinction is first mentioned in Acts 6 where the apostles were devoted to prayer and the word. Then, seven men were selected to handle more practical matters. Stephen is commonly known as the first deacon in the church.

This division of labor in the church is seen today in the distinction between the office of elder and deacon.

There are qualifications for the men who would serve as deacons. I Timothy 3:8-13 stipulates that the deacon must not be an addict, not greedy, blameless, the husband of one wife, and an able manager of his family. There is a decided moral and spiritual character required of the deacon.

As our church considers deacons to assist our elder these things must be kept in mind as we prayerfully select men.

- I Timothy 3 indicates nine qualifications for deacons.
 - 1. Dignified He is honorable, worthy, respected.
- 2. Not double-tongued He must have credibility in what he speaks.



- 3. Not addicted to much wine He must have self-control and discipline in his life.
- 4. Not greedy for dishonest gain He cannot be a lover of money or the things of the world.
- 5. Sound in faith and life He must hold to the true gospel without wavering and his behavior must be consistent with his confession of true doctrine.
- 6. Blameless His character must be tested and examined by the church.
- 7. Godly wife His wife must be dignified and respectable, not a gossip or slanderer.
- 8. Husband of one wife He must be faithful in his marriage to his wife.
- 9. Manage children and household well He is a spiritual leader of his wife and children.

As to the responsibilities of the deacon in the church, his main role is that of servant, for the very word "deacon" means "server."

Certain duties of deacons in our church would be these:

Distribution of holy communion – Liturgical deacons assist the elder in distributing the blood of Jesus in holy communion.

Facilities – Deacons are responsible for managing the facility for worship and Bible study in preparation, providing order during services, and afterward. This involves doors, security, childcare, climate control, lighting, sound, ushering, greeting, etc.

Charity – Deacons manage the charity fund in order to help those with material need.

Logistics – Deacons are available to help in various tasks such as transportation, visitation, support, etc. in order that the elder may concentrate on teaching and shepherding the church.



And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. (Deut 6: 6-7 ESV)

This is a brand new release that might be a good resource to put on a gift wish list for family or friends. The publisher lists this for ages 6 - 10 and



provides several features in this Bible: Parent Connections, Bible Narratives, Character Sketches, Christ Connections, Big Questions and Answers, and Big Words.

The translation is the ESV which may be the version you are already using and is the version being used in the pew Bibles.

In browsing through the preview pages the layout balances information and points to consider while reading Scripture or a narrative. There are also sidebar prayers that help teach that the text informs as well as leads our prayers. Also included as sidebar are verses to learn called "Verses for Life."

If you have older children you might have them read the listed text from their own Bibles and then use this book to bring about family discussion. If your children are younger this could be a good starting point and then a later reference tool with "do you remember when we read…" and refer to the character sketches or other features.

While this is not ready for release until mid October you can get a preview, or pre-order from both Amazon or Concordia Publishing. If you go to the CPH.org site you can get a look inside for the features mentioned.

How does your day start? For many, it is probably pretty predictable. For others it can be more of "if this is Tuesday it must be..." and fill in the blank. However, technology probably plays a fairly large part in not only starting your day but keeping you on track throughout the day.

If you have moved to a life more aligned to technology have you also considered including your devotional time incorporated with your technology? There are numerous options and it does not have to be

an either/or but can be a both/and.



One of the devotionals available in the church narthex is "Reflections" a devotional from Higher Things. You may even have a copy and intend to use it daily, but things do not always go as planned. Fortunately you can have "Reflections" sent to your email that you access via your

smartphone or tablet, or you can open the Higher Things/Reflections site via your browser and have it added to your home screen so that when you have those few moments you can read the day's devotional and not have to type in the location each time.

The advantage of adding the website shortcut to your phone or tablet is that you can search the archives. You may want to do both as having it sent to your daily email serves as a reminder.

Whichever electronic version you choose, you also have the option of listening to the audio file. It can sometimes be helpful to listen as you read. Both versions also allow you to click on the scriptures listed at the top of the devotional.

However your day starts, technology can be a godly part of ordering your life.



HYMNS THAT SING OF CHRIST: LSB 563 "JESUS, THY BLOOD AND RIGHTEOUSNESS"

Jesus, Thy blood and righteousness My beauty are, my glorious dress; Midst flaming world, in these arrayed, With joy shall I lift up my head.

Bold shall I stand in that great day, Cleansed and redeemed, no debt to pay; Fully absolved through these I am From sin and fear, from guilt and shame.

Lord, I believe Thy precious blood, Which at the mercy seat of God Pleads for the captives' liberty, Was also shed in love for me.

Lord, I believe, were sinners more Than sands upon the ocean shore, Thou hast for all a ransom paid, For all a full atonement made.

When from the dust of death I rise To claim my mansion in the skies, This then shall be my only plea: Jesus hath lived and died for me.

Jesus, be endless praise to thee, Whose boundless mercy hath for me, For me, and all Thy hands have made, An everlasting ransom paid.

This is a wonderfully uplifting hymn that speaks to the believer of his justification found only in the blood and righteousness of our Lord Jesus Christ. The words of this hymn can only be spoken of as "glorious." The sinner, in thankfulness and praise, drops to his knees before the beauty of our Savior.

Count Nicolaus Ludwig Von Zinzendorf (1700-1760), founder of the reorganized Moravian church, or United brethren, wrote the original of this hymn in 33 stanzas while returning home in 1739 from a visit to a Moravian Mission on the Island of St. Thomas in the West Indies.

Count Zinzendorf was born in Dresden, the son of a wealthy nobleman whose family had Pietistic sympathies. He graduated from Wittenberg University in 1719 to become Poet to the Saxon Court.

Zinzendorf first became interested in the Moravian Brethren when he met one of the members of this persecuted sect - a carpenter, who hoped to relocate his community in Saxony. Zinzendorf offered his newly purchase estate of Bertheldsorf to house the Moravians and in 1722 the settlement was established. In ten years the colony grew to about 600 members, having become a haven for persecuted Christians from Moravia and Bohemia, with Zinzendorf as its superintendent. Criticized for his associations with the Moravians who were in disfavor with the predominantly Lutheran country, he found to be sound. He was granted a license to preach and became a Moravian (United Brethren) bishop. He was banished from Saxony the same year on a charge of false doctrine. He then established other missions in Germany, Holland, Great Britain, and America. In 1748, his banishment was repealed and he returned to Herrnhut where he spent the rest of his life. He died a poor man, having used his fortune on religious work.

Zinzendorf wrote hymns from the time he was twelve years old until his death. Some 2,000 hymns are attributed to him, some of them good and some of them not so good, most too subjective and emotional for congregational use. We have one other of his hymns in our hymnal:

Jesus, Lead Thou On.

The tune, St. Crispin, was written by George Job Elvey (1816-1893). Elvey was born in Canterbury, England. He studied under his elder brother Stephen, at Canterbury Cathedral. Later he studied at the Royal Academy of Music becoming an accomplished organist at the age of seventeen. At the age of nineteen, he was selected by King William, IV as organist and master of the boys at St. George's Chapel, Windsor. Elvey received the Bachelor of Music degree from Oxford in 1838 and the doctorate in 1840 by special dispensation of the chancellor. He was knighted in 1871 after composing a Festival March for the marriage of Princess Louise. He wrote the tunes to the following hymns in our hymnal:

Come Ye Thankful People Come Songs of Thankfulness and Praise Crown Him With Many Crowns

He is buried outside the west front of St. George's Chapel.
