from the Pastor...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This is now the third installment in a series unpacking our mission statement. Since the last newsletter, as a congregation we've approved our updated Constitution and Bylaws. It was this process of updating the Constitution and Bylaws which led me to begin this newsletter series about our mission statement. Now, because we've approved those updates, this mission statement remains the concise summary of who we are and what we do as a congregation. In other words, we'd better not look to change the mission statement any time soon, else we'll have to go through another long update process for the Constitution and Bylaws. Nonetheless, we also should not look to change the mission statement any time soon, but instead see it as a gift from those who have come before us, a gift which we should live out and apply to our congregation still today, as opposed to accommodating the mission statement to our present circumstances.

Here again is our full mission statement: "Redeemer Evangelical Lutheran Church is a community of believers saved by God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ. As a people enabled by the Spirit, we are committed to regular worship and the use of the sacraments, studying and teaching the Bible, praying, using our gifts and talents in God's service, caring and nurturing of others, and sharing the message of God's salvation so that God is glorified and all people may know Jesus as their Savior and Lord." In the previous two newsletters, we've expanded on "Redeemer Evangelical Lutheran Church" and "is a community of believers saved by God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ." For this newsletter, I'd like to focus on the phrase "as a people enabled by the Spirit."

It is fitting that we look at this phrase after celebrating the church festival days of Ascension and Pentecost. Of course on Ascension Day, Jesus Christ ascended into heaven so that He could reign from the throne of God and so that He could be present everywhere. But that also means He is not physically present to help us do the work He has called us to do in the world, to be salt and light in the world. Thankfully, Jesus promised He would not leave us as orphans in the world (John 14:18). He makes multiple promises about the sending of the Holy Spirit. John 14:16 says, "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another

Helper, to be with you forever, even the Spirit of truth." John 14:26 says, "But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, he will teach you all things and bring to your remembrance all that I have said to you." John 15:26 says, "But when the Helper comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of Truth, who proceeds from the Father, he will

bear witness about me." And John 16:13 says, "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth, for he will not speak on his own authority, but whatever he hears he will speak, and he will declare to you the things that are to come." And on the Day of Pentecost, all these promises came true when the Holy Spirit was poured out on the whole world, upon all people.

Now, in the stead of Jesus Christ, the Holy Spirit bears witness and teaches about the truth of Christ to the world and He guides and enables us, the children of God, to do the work Jesus has called us to do in the world. The Holy Spirit bears witness and teaches through the Word of God and the Sacraments. And the Holy Spirit guides and enables us to trust in the truth of Jesus Christ, to do the good works God has prepared for us, to work for God in our vocations, and to make known Christ's saving work to the world. All of this is known as sanctification, which is simply a big, theological way of saying that the Holy Spirit makes us holy, even here on earth during our lives, before we reach perfect holiness in heaven, in the dwelling place of God.

There is a special comfort that comes from knowing we don't have to make Jesus Christ known to the world all on our own, that we aren't haphazardly brought together as a community of believers, but that we are enabled by the Holy Spirit to make Christ known, that we are brought together and guided in this community by the Holy Spirit. And there is even more comfort in knowing that we don't have to accept the Holy Spirit or do anything for Him to work through us, but instead He teaches, guides, and enables us because we have been baptized into Him, having been baptized in the name of God the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Thus, next time we'll explore what exactly the Holy Spirit enables us to do.




And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. (Deut 6: 6-7 ESV)

Summer vacation! If you have children in the home you are already into school vacation and have probably heard "there's nothing to do!" Time to get creative in filling out the rest of the weeks of vacation. If you haven't planned anything, here's a suggestion that might involve the whole family including godly use of technology.

Take a minute and think back to your own school days and you probably had a teacher who announced within the first 2-3 days back to school, "write 500 words on what I did on my summer vacation" or some variation of that. Hear the groans especially from those who did not go to their way of thinking on a wonderful, fabulous, fun-filled holiday.

If you live in California there are many places you can go, and not just Magic Mountain and Disneyland. As parents you are always looking for ways to impart knowledge in ways that don't seem like school and can actually be enjoyable. Have you ever thought of visiting all of the missions in California?



From where we live in Chico, CA many of the missions can be seen in a day trip (ok, a long day). Several could be a weekend trip and going to the missions in southern CA could be combined with something else.

If you grew up in California, or at least went to

elementary school, you studied the missions in about the 4<sup>th</sup> grade. You probably drew pictures, or at least colored some. Perhaps you were in a group that made a replica of one of the missions. You learned facts about the missions such as they were about 30 miles apart which meant a messenger could go from one mission to another in a day.

While you might have learned that the missions were founded by Catholic priests as they worked with the native peoples to bring Christianity. There was also a political agenda going on. A strong at that time Spanish presence kept other European countries from claiming the land.

If your children go to public school they will not get the lessons of God using the missions to do more than just colonize the native peoples. And, the aspect of bringing Christianity may be downplayed.

There is a lot of information you can find out about the missions using your computer. So this becomes a project that can involve your older children in doing some research and helping compile questions to help study about the missions. You might even consider an audio/visual record of your mission explorations.

Be creative! Find joy in the journey! Praise God for how Christ was brought to the native people of California. If you have friends or neighbors of native origins you might even ask them if they have connections back to the mission days and ask them if they will share their stories with your family.

This could be a project that covers several years and will answer that question of what you did on your summer vacation for years to come. For more thoughts read the Technology article.

#### Technology... a summer project

If you haven't read the Children's Resources article in this issue of the newsletter make sure to read that, preferably before you read this article as it will make more sense. As always, we look for godly ways to use technology and if your family has children in several age levels finding activities that can actually involve all ages can be challenging. Yes, even grandparents can get involved in this project.

The project is learning about, visiting and recording your thoughts and impressions as your family visits the Missions of California. Yes, all 21 of them.

Doing some internet research about the missions of California brings up a wealth of information. There are many resources for teachers so you can get an idea of what children will be taught, or perhaps not taught.

If your family has older children as well as younger, ask the older children to do some of the research on the missions. If you have relatives who live in various areas of California you might even have your older children contact them to see if they have visited the mission close to them and if not would they like to be part of this project.

To start off the project a family planning night (pizza anyone?) to brainstorm, write down questions and thoughts to research as a first step to get the ball rolling. Friends, relatives and neighbors with children of similar ages could be included to see if they might be interested in joining your family. But don't forget grandma and grandpa at least in the exploration stage.

Here are a few questions to get the research going:

- How many missions are there in California?
- How did the missions get started?
- What was the reason for the missions?
- Are there still church services at the missions?

Have a great summer planning your mission explorations.

#### FROM THE PRESIDENT

## Approval of Constitution & Bylaws Revisions

Greetings and God's Blessings to everyone,

On June 9, at a Voters Assembly, our congregation approved proposed revisions of our constitution and bylaws. This was the second of two meetings to present and approve the revised documents. Our next step will be to resubmit the revisions and relay our congregational approval to our LCMS District (CNH) to receive their final signoff.

Some significant areas that were modified in the documents are listed below.

- The office of vice president is no longer identified as a "legal officer", in conformance with California corporate law.
- A call for nominations to fill the positions of officers of the congregation shall be communicated at least 30 days before the voters meeting
- Resolutions, which are approved by the council, shall be brought before the voters assembly at their next meeting.
- Electronic voting by council members is permitted under certain conditions.
- The section on administration of church funds has been moved to its own document, which will be maintained by the church council.
- All changes to the constitution and bylaws shall be reviewed by CNH district as a condition for continued membership in the LCMS
- All references regarding the offices of vicar and teacher have been removed
- The process for calling ordained or commissioned church workers has been rewritten


