from the Pastor...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Since this is the final newsletter for the year 2024, let's conclude our series on our Church Mission Statement. Since the last newsletter, our updated Church Constitution and Bylaws have finally been approved by our District leaders and thus we can say that our C&B now better helps us carry out the mission of our church in our current time and place.

So as usual, what is the mission of our church? "Redeemer Evangelical Lutheran Church is a community of believers saved by God's grace through faith in Jesus Christ. As a people enabled by the Spirit, we are committed to regular worship and the use of the sacraments, studying and teaching the Bible, praying, using our gifts and talents in God's service, caring and nurturing of others, and sharing the message of God's salvation so that God is glorified and all people may know Jesus as their Savior and Lord." Today to conclude, we're taking up "using our gifts and talents in God's service, caring and nurturing of others, and sharing the message of God's salvation so that God is glorified and all people may know Jesus as their Savior and Lord." And remember, each of these tasks is modified by that phrase "as a people enabled by the Spirit." All of the good works we do individually and as a congregation are done by the power of the Holy Spirit working in us for the sake of God's kingdom.

First, when we read or hear "using our gifts and talents in God's service," what we probably think is using our money and time in God's service. And that's certainly a big part of gifts and talents, but more broadly this is about a theology of stewardship. God has given us everything that we need to support this body and life, (yes, with some having more and some having less). Thus, part of saying "thank you" to God for His gifts is stewarding them wisely, as well as giving back to God a portion of His gifts and trusting that He will continue to give gifts. In the holy ark of the Christian church, God blesses us by keeping us safe in the boat, and even sees fit to allow us to pick up an oar and help direct and propel the boat in the way God would have us go. All this to say, a theology of stewardship means if God has blessed you with good finances, we need your gifts and offerings to

keep the bills paid and to supply the pastor, office manager, organist, janitor, and other workers with livable wages. If God has blessed you with extra time, and you're not too tired, we need volunteers to hold officer positions, to be deacons, to be part of the altar guild, to be part of the fellowship board, and to do some manual labor tasks around the church building.

If God has blessed you with a special talent or hobby, (such as woodworking or sewing), we can find a way for you to utilize that talent or hobby in God's service. If God has simply blessed you with another day of life, we still want to see you at church each week and together be brothers and sisters in Christ. And as a church, Redeemer Lutheran practices good stewardship, using our gifts and talents in God's service by not hoarding gifts and offerings but supporting a variety of missions and utilizing our unique talents as a church for the good of our neighborhood and community.

Second, "caring and nurturing of others" certainly has in mind caring for others when they're going through difficult times, such as during a hospital stay or recovery from an illness or incident or surgery, but this also has in mind caring for others during regular parts of life too. Martin Luther wrote in his Smalcald Articles that the mutual conversation and consolation of brothers and sisters in Christ is a form of the gospel. How often are you praying for others, especially fellow members of the congregation, in your homes or during your regular prayers? How often are you getting to know others at church? How often are you encouraging regular church attendance and Bible study attendance from others? How often are you talking about the Scriptures and sermons with others? Enabled by the Spirit, all of these are not works of the law, but opportunities of the gospel to strengthen you and your own faith. How blessed are we to have a church community who cares for us, and we in turn care for them, when so many in today's culture have no one or a very small community.

Finally, Redeemer Evangelical Lutheran Church is only a community as long as there is a community of believers here, which means we should always be looking to grow our church community. Again enabled by the Spirit, we do this by "sharing the message of



It is not often that a unique book comes at just the right time. This book *N Is for Nativity* published just last year would be a wonderful addition to your children's library. While it is listed as a book for younger children, it would probably still keep the interest of early

elementary children especially if only brought out each year just as Advent begins.

If you have been working on teaching your children their ABC's this book will fit right in. It starts right out with Advent (A is for Advent) and goes through Z is for Zechariah.

It is beautifully illustrated and has a wonderful Glossary that will help more fully develop words for your older children. As a parent you could also use this as the basis for family discussion.

The book is available from both Concordia Publishing House and Amazon. Amazon also has a kindle edition which could be useful if you are traveling.

TECHNOLOGY



Technology... artificial intelligence

What is artificial intelligence (AI) or as Apple says, "Apple intelligence." Is it new or has it been around but just not announced? Is it good, helpful, intelligent or is it harmful, deceitful, or problematic? If you found yourself answering "yes," well maybe actually "no," you are right in both cases.

Think back to the days of using a typewriter. You pressed one key at a time. Next look at your computer. If you have been using a computer for many, many years you still remember pressing one key at a time. Then after a while you noticed that when you were using a word processing program for example pressing a key such as "a" there might appear the word "and" thinking that was the logical choice. Other words you frequently used might have the same results.

Because AI is causing the computer to recognize patterns it determines that most of the time when you type "a" the word is "and." This can be useful for example if a certain phrase perhaps containing 4 or 5 words will be used in an article you are writing. Think back to that manual typewriter you used and how much easier it would have been to write that report if that phrase automatically typed itself.

Next think about searching for something using the internet. You might not know exactly what something is called but entering a word or two can get you started. Your screen shows numerous possibilities or even suggests alternatives. Helpful, yes, but it can also lead you down a pathway it would be best not to go. Sometimes these innocent searches can actually sign you up for something you had not intended.

Do the suggestions that come up when you are searching Amazon for instance cause you to purchase something you were not intending? Possibly, but the suggestions could actually direct you to something useful.

The bottom line: be careful, be aware and don't just accept what appears on your screen whether that is your computer or your phone. Remember to use technology in a godly way.
